Symptoms of Demonic Attack

If you have one or more of these symptoms you might need deliverance.

- 1. A compulsive desire to blaspheme God
- 2. A revulsion against the Bible, including a desire to tear it up or destroy it
- 3. Compulsive thoughts of suicide or murder
- 4. -Cutting or physically abusing oneself
- 5. Deep feelings of bitterness and hatred toward others without reason: Jews, other races, the church, strong Christian leaders
- 6. Any compulsive temptations that push you toward thoughts or behavior you truly do not want to think or engage in
- 7. Compulsive desires to tear other people down, even if it means lying to do so
- 8. Terrifying feelings of guilt even after honest confession is made to the Lord
- 9. Certain physical symptoms that may appear suddenly or leave quickly and for which there are no physical or physiological reasons
- 10. Choking sensations
- 11. Pains that seem to move around and for which there is no medical cause
- 12. Feelings of tightness about the head or eyes
- 13. Dizziness, blackouts, or fainting seizures
- 14. Deep depression and despondency (frequently and at significant times)
- 15. Sudden surges of violent rage, uncontrollable anger, or seething feelings of hostility
- 16. Terrifying doubt of one's salvation even though they once knew the joy of salvation
- 17. Seizures of panic or other fear that is terrifying
- 18. Dreams or nightmares that are of a horrific nature and often recurring
- 19. Clairvoyant dreams that may even come true as these are most often demonic
- 20. Abnormal or perverted sexual desires
- 21. Questions and challenges to God's Word
- 22. Sleep or eating disorders without a physical cause
- 23. Most compulsions and obsessions
- 24. Rebellion and hatred for authority
- 25. Bizarre terrifying thoughts that seem to come from nowhere and that the person cannot control
- 26. Fascination with the occult
- 27. Involvement in criminal activity
- 28. Extremely low self-image (feeling unworthy, like you are a failure, no good, and other emotions that constantly undermine the self-identity)
- 29. Constant confusion in one's thinking (sometimes having great difficulty remembering things)
- 30. Inability to believe (even when the person wants to)
- 31. Mocking and blasphemous thoughts against preaching/teaching of the Word of God
- 32. Perceptual distortions—perceiving anger or hostility in others when it doesn't really exist
- 33. Seeing only judgment in the Scriptures
- 34. Horrible nightmares causing fear (as they often have demonic images)

- 35. Violent thoughts (suicidal, homicidal, self-abuse, and so on)
- 36. Hatred and bitterness toward others for no justifiable reason
- 37. Tremendous hostility or fear when encountering someone involved in deliverance work
- 38. Feelings of being watched or sensing an evil presence
- 39. Irrational fears, panic attacks, phobias
- 40. Irrational anger, rage
- 41. Irrational guilt, self-condemnation to the extreme
- 42. Desire to do what is right but the inability to carry it out
- 43. Sudden personality and attitude changes that are severe contrasts (causing the person to appear schizophrenic)
- 44. Bipolar disorder
- 45. A strong aversion to Scripture reading and prayer (especially one-on-one)
- 46. A dark countenance (a steely or hollow look in the eyes, contraction of the pupils, facial features that contort or change, often an inability to look at a person directly)
- 47. Lying, exaggerating, or stealing compulsively (often wondering why)
- 48. Drug abuse (especially when there are demonic hallucinations)
- 49. Eating obsessions, including bulimia and anorexia nervosa
- 50. Compulsive sexual sins (especially perversions)
- 51. Irrational laughter or crying
- 52. Sudden speaking of a language not previously known (often an ethnic language of ancestors)
- 53. Negative reactions to the name and blood of Jesus Christ (verbally or through body language)
- 54. Extreme restlessness (especially in a spiritual environment)
- 55. Uncontrollable cutting and mocking tongue
- 56. Vulgar language and actions
- 57. Loss of time (from minutes to hours; ending up someplace, not knowing how you got there; regularly doing things of which there is no memory)
- 58. Extreme sleepiness around spiritual things
- 59. Demonstration of extraordinary abilities (either ESP or telekinesis)
- 60. Voices heard in the mind that mock, intimidate, accuse, threaten, or bargain
- 61. Voice that refers to the individual in the third person
- 62. Supernatural experiences, such as hauntings, movement or disappearance of objects, and other strange manifestations
- 63. Seizures that last too long and/or are too regular
- 64. Blackouts
- 65. Sudden temporary interference with bodily functions, such as buzzing in the ears, an inability to speak or hear, severe headache, hypersensitivity in hearing or touch, chills or overwhelming heat in body, numbness in the arms or legs, or temporary paralysis
- 66. Having a couple of symptoms may not indicate anything, but these are common symptoms of things that demons do. When we have an idea of what the person is dealing with, we can identify possible entry points
